A Brief History of the University

The v.v. John Committee was appointed by the Government of Gujarat in April; 1973 to review the status of higher education and establish new universities. Following the recommendations of the committee, the North Gujarat University has been established by the North Gujarat University Ordinance (Gujarat Ordinance No.5 of 1986, dated 17-05-1986). The Ordinance was later converted into an Act, passed the by Gujarat Legislative Assembly on 29-08-the 1986 as the North Gujarat University Act (No. 22 of 1986, dated 10-09-1986). This University has now been renamed as Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University (by Gujarat Act No. 2 of 2003 dated 01-03-2003), to honour the great philosopher, thinker, and Jain acharya Hemchandracharya Suri, who made a valuable contribution to the study of grammar, literature, religion, and philosophy.

The jurisdiction of the University covers five districts Viz., Patan, Mehsana, Banaskantha, Sabarkantha, and Aravalli, and caters to this region's cultural and educational needs.

Emblem of the University

The emblem of the University contains a picture of Saraswati framed in a gavaksha or Niche, Devi Saraswati, traditionally representing learning, is depicted after a painting in the old Prakrit manuscript of Dash-Vaikalik. The design of Gavaksha, simple and elegant, is adapted from the excavation of "Rani ki Vay" in Patan.

The emblem thus recalls Gujarat's ancient art and culture at the peak of its glory centuries ago, when Patan was a great center of learning.

The motto invokes the divine blessing of sacred knowledge. It also relates to the Saraswati, the holy Vedic Kumarika River on the bank of which the University is located symbolizes an endless flow of ever-growing knowledge.

Acharya Hemchandrayaji

Acharya Hemchandra was born in 1088 A.D. into the Modha Vanik (merchant) caste, in the town of Dhandhuka, sixty miles from the city Ahmedabad in Gujarat State. His parents were Chachadev and Pahini. When Pahini was pregnant, she had a beautiful dream. She narrated her dream to Acharya Devasuri, who was in Dhandhuks at that time. The acharya said that Pahini was to give birth to a son who would make great progress in the areas of spiritual knowledge, intuition, and conduct. Upon birth, the child was named Changdeva.

The next time Acharya Devasuri was in Dhandhuka, he saw Pahini carrying her son. He said to Pahini, "Let me take care of this brilliant son. He is destined to be a great spiritual leader." However, he could not convince her to give him her son. The acharya kept pursuing and reminding her that her son would become a famous monk and would glorify the Jain Order. Again, he requested that she should sacrifice her self-interest and love for the child for the good of the people. Ultimately, Pahini let the acharya take her son with him.

He initiated Changdeva into monkhood and named him Somachandra. The disciple was very intelligent and soon mastered the Darshanas, Scriptures, Nyaya, grammar, etc. At the same time, he cultivated excellent virtues like forbearance, tolerance, holiness, simplicity, discipline, chastity, and generosity. Somehandra was incomparable in administration and efficiency. Acharya Devasuri made Somachandra an acharya when he was only twenty-one years old. At that time, he was given the name Hemchandra Acharya.

About University

The geographical jurisdiction of the Hernchandracharya North Gujarat University encompasses five districts—
Mehsana, Patan, Banaskantha, Sabarkantha, and Aravall Each one of the five districts has its district heritage.
Geographically a part of the whole area is towards the desert of Kutchh, while on the Northeast side are rocky regions of forest populated by the tribal. The economy of the area is largely based on agriculture. There are a few towns here and no big city. The rest of the population lives in villages. To cater to the peculiar cultural and educational needs of the area. Hemchandracharaya North Gujarat University was established by Ordinance No. 5 of 1986 dated 17-5-1986 which was later passed as the North Gujarat University Act No.22 of 1986 on 11/9/86 by the Legislative Assembly of Gujarat. The University has been functioning since then and growing and expanding steadily.

PATAN a town in the Patan district was chosen for the University Headquarters. The historical importance of the place cannot be underestimated. For centuries, it had been the capital city of a large kingdom extending far beyond the boundaries of present-day Gujarat, under the Solanki rulers and a very important seat of Jain scholarship. It is the holy land of Hemchandracharya a great thinker who made a valuable contribution to the studies of grammar, literature, religion, and philosophy. The RANI-KI-VAV, Queen's Stepwell, the 900 years old Structure was constructed by Gujjar King Bhimdev of the Solanki dynasty and was attributed to Queen Udayamati. It has been listed as one of UNESCO's World Heritage sites since 2014. The new ₹100 currency note bears the image of Ran-Ki-Vav which looks system like a temple cum water storage system. Patan is known for 'Patola', a doable lkat woven highly valued silk sarees. A great architectural and sculptural monument of ears, the lakes of Sahastralinga and Khansarovar, the Jain temples of Panchasara, and a few other remains in and around the place testify to the glory that was Patan, in the not-so-distant past.

About Patan

In childhood, you built, yourself a fort of sheets and pillows, and discovered that the enclosure gave you the freedom to explore. Now enter the town of Patan, hugged by its fort walls and gates still largely intact, and re-discover the spirit of play.

You meander through the bustling bazaar of this charismatic town. Tucked away among the Havelis in the narrow pole you stumble upon rope or bidi (traditional cigarette) makers working on their doorsteps. You go on a treasure hunt in search of the unique patola and mashru weavers, the snow-white Jain temples, and a library of ancient Hindu and Jain texts.

You find yourself leaving the city walls and heading northwest as if something calls you. On your way to Anhilvada Patan, the ancient city that served as Gujarat's capital for 650 years, you find the 1000-year-old Kali temple from where Kali Mata the kuldevi (family goddess) of the Solanki dynasty, guards the town. Furthest north, you find the Sahastralinga Talav, literally "lake of a thousand lingas", which is finely constructed to channel water in from the nearby Saraswati, and you begin to realize that it is the sanctity of water that has been and still is, beckoning you. You turn around and come towards the edge of Rani Ki Vav, the "Queen's stepwell", and as you descend into the cool air towards the water, the carved stone gods and consorts invite you into their world, the world of spirit and the sacred. Here, in the infinite, your journey is always just beginning.

The ancient city of Anahilvada Patan was founded by Vanraj Chavda, the first of the Chavda dynasty. Legend has it that he laid the foundation at the place pointed out by Anahil, a shepherd friend from his younger days, and named the city after him.

The city remained the capital of Gujarat for 650 years, from 746-1411, after the center of power moved from Saurashtra around the same time that the separate kingdoms of the area were integrated into roughly what we today call Gujarat. It was ruled by like dynasties: the Chavda, Solanki, and finally Vaghela. Under the Solanki rule, 942-1244, Anahilvada shone as a center of trade, learning, and architectural achievements. It was also a thriving center for Jainism, and the Solanki rulers commissioned many Hindu and Jain temples, as well as other civic and religious constructions.

During the Vaghela rule towards the end of the 13th century, Ulugh Khan, a commander under Allaudin Khilji, plundered the town and destroyed it completely. In 1411 the capital shifted to the newly founded Ahmedabad, leaving Patan as a shadow of its former glory. One of the positive effects of Muslim rule in Patan is the presence of some of the earliest Muslim buildings in Gujarat, built before even the earliest famous constructions in Ahmedabad.

The ruins of the ancient city, with the farnous Rani Ki Vav and Sahastralinga Talav, stand about 2 km northwest of the quaint town of present-day Patan, which is known for its patola saris and mashru weavers.

1. Music

- (a) Classical Vocal Solo; (Hindustani/Kamataka)
- Only one entry per Institution is allowed. Duration of performance-10 min.
- Time for stage/ Instruments setting is a maximum of 5 minutes.
- (3) Maximum number of accompanists is two.
- (4) Item can be presented in either Hindustani or Karnataka style.
- (5) Cinema songs are not allowed under this item.
- (6) Sufficient thought and care must be exercised in the choice of Raga and composition.
- (7) Judgment will be based on the qualities like tal, selection of raga, composition, and general impression.

2. Classical Instrumental Solo (Percussion - Tal Vadya)

- Only one entry per institution is allowed. Duration of performance-10 min.
- (2) Time for stage/ instruments setting is a maximum of 5 minutes.
- Maximum number of accompanists is two.
- (4) Participants must bring their instruments.
- (5) Item can be presented in either Hindustani or Karnataka style.
- (6) Judgment will be based on the qualities like tal, selection of raga, composition, and general impression.

3. Classical Instrumental Solo (Non- Percussion - Swara Vadya)

- Only one entry per institution is allowed. Duration of performance-10 min.
- (2) Time for stage/ Instruments setting is a maximum of 5 minutes.
- Maximum number of accompanists is two.
- (4) Participants must bring their instruments, Casio is not allowed.
- (5) Instruments of western origin adopted to the Indian Raga system are allowed.
- (6) Item can be presented in either Hindustani or Karnataka style.
- (7) Judgment will be based on the qualities like Swara, tal, selection of raga, composition, and general impression.

4. Light Vocal (Indian)

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed.
- (2) Time for Stage/Instruments setting is a maximum of 2 minutes.
- (3) The number of accompanists would not be more than two.
- (4) Duration of the song shall be between 4 to 6 minutes.
- (5) Only non-film songs/ geet/ ghazal/ bhajan/ Shabad and abhyanga can be presented.
- (6) Judgment will be made on the qualities like Swara, tal, selection of raga, composition, and general impression.

5. Western Vocal Solo

- Only one entry per institution is allowed.
- (2) Time for Stage/ Instruments setting is a maximum of 2 minutes.
- (3) The number of accompanists would not be more than two.
- (4) Duration of the song shall be between 4 to 6 minutes.
- (5) Language of the song shall only be English.
- (6) Judgment will be made on the qualities like composition rhythm, coordination, and general impression

Group Song (Indian)

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed.
- A team must present two songs, one patriotic and another will be folksongs.
- Maximum 6 singers in a group and the number of accompanists playing instruments shall be three.
- (4) The group songs should be taken from Indian songs which can be in regional language.
- No film song should be presented as a group song.
- (6) Maximum time allowed for the group song is 10 minutes which does not include setting time. The setting time for a group shall not exceed 4 minutes.
- (7) Judging of this item will be based on the quality of the singing only and not on make-up, costumes, and actions of the team.

7. Group Songs (Western)

- Only one entry per institution is allowed.
- Maximum 6 singers in a group maximum number of accompanists playing instruments shall be three.
- The group songs should be taken from the English language.
- (4) Maximum time allowed for the group song is 10 minutes which does not include setting time. The setting time for a group shall not exceed 5 minutes.
- (5) Judging of this item will be based on the quality of singing only and not on make-up, costumes, and actions of the team.

8. Folk Orchestra

- Each University can send only one team.
- (2) The team shall consist of up to 12 participants.
- The group can consist of all boys or all girls or combined.
- (4) The duration of the performance will be a minimum of 7 and a maximum of 10 minutes.
- (5) This does not include setting time which shall not be more than 5 minutes.
- (6) Up to three professional accompanists are allowed who should be in a different dress from the student participants so that they could be easily identified.
- (7) The professional accompanists shallsit/stand separately from the participants and shall not lead the team.

(8) The team may present preferably those folk tunes which are recognized as folk tunes of the state to which the university belongs)

9. Folk/Tribal Dance

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed.
- (2) Maximum 10 participants allowed per team. The team may consist of all boys, all girls, or a mixture of both.
- The number of accompanists permissible is five.
- (4) The dance can be either primitive or a folk dance (Indian Style) but not a classical one.
- Duration of the dance should not be more than 10 minutes.
- (6) Three copies of a brief note giving the theme and the text of the song if any, are to be submitted along with the entry form at the time of registration.
- (7) The participating team will be responsible for the removal of their sets/properties etc. immediately after the completion of their performance.
- (8) Judgment will be based on Rhythm, Formation, Expression, Costumes, and Make-up, and Sets on Overall Effect.
- (9) Time for sets/Instruments setting is a maximum of 5 minutes.

10. Classical Dance (Indian)

- Each Institute can send only one entry.
- Classical dance can be from any of the approved schools of dance. Such as Kathak, Kathakali, Bharat Natyam, Manipuri, Kuchipudi, Mohinittam, Odissi, etc.
- (3) Participants will be allowed up to 15 minutes including time for preparation. A Maximum of three accompanists is permissible.
- (4) Judgment will be based on the qualities like Tal, Technique, Rhythm, Abhinaya or Expression, Costumes, Footwork, and general impression, etc.
- (5) Three copies of a brief note on the description of the dance story involved init, if any, and of the accompanying song, with its meaning in Hindi or English must be submitted at the time of registration.

11. Quiz

- Each Institute can send a team of three persons.
- There will be a written preliminary round and teams will be elected for the final.
- Finals will be oral with audio-visual questions.
- (4) The Specific rules regarding the evaluation procedure, time to reply to a particular answer, and the type of round will be given before the actual start of the competition.

12. Elecution

- Each Institute will be represented by one speaker.
- Medium of expression will be Hindi or English.
- (3) Each speaker will be allowed to speak for maximum five minutes in the Zonal Festival and 10 minutes in the National Festival.
- (4) Subject / Topic of Elocution will be announced in the manager's meeting.
- (5) The performance will be judged in one language.
- (6) The item shall be prose or poetry and not a song.
- (7) The sequence of speakers will be decided by a draw of lots.

13. Debate

- Each Institute will be represented by the two debtors, one will speak for, while another will speak AGAINST the motion.
- Medium of expression will be Hindi or English.
- Topic of the Debater will be announced 24 hours in advance.
- (4) Each debater will be allowed to speak for maximum five minutes in the Zonal Festival and 10 minutes in the National Festival.
- (5) The competitor from each Institute will speak FOR and AGAINST the motion. Paper reading is not allowed.

14. One-Act-Play

- Only one entry shall be accepted from each institution.
- The duration of the play should not exceed 30 minutes.
- (3) Time will be counted as soon as the signal is given or the team starts giving an introduction, whichever is earlier. Empty stage to empty stage shall be followed strictly. For stage setting and removal of set and properties, up to 10 minutes will be given after taking charge of the stage.
- (4) The number of participants should not exceed nine and the maximum number of accompanists should not exceed three. The participating team shall bring their own set/ stage property, make-up material, etc. Light and general properties such as ordinary furniture may be provided with advanced information.
- (5) Participants may speak in Hindl, English, or any regional language of India. In case, the language is a regional one, the synopsis of the play with a translation in, English or Hindi must be submitted to the In-charge of the competition on the day of
- (6) registration.
- (7) The participating team must report to the in charge of the competition at least two hours before the presentation of the play.
- (8) Judgment will most likely be based on the qualities of the play like theme, work on acting, stagecraft, design, and general impression etc.
- (9) Decision of the panel of judges will be final and binding upon all.
- (10) Accompanists will either speak from the background or will play musical instruments for background music. They shall not appear on the stage.

15. Skit

- Only one team per institute will be allowed.
- Maximum number of six participants are allowed to participate in this item.
- (3) Maximum time allotted for each team is 10 minutes.
- (4) Use of make-up, drapery, and background music is allowed. No personal remarks, aspersions, character assassination, etc. is allowed.
- (5) Participating team should submit three copies of the synopsis of the theme of the Skit, along with the language of the presentation (Hindi or English) on the day of registration.
- (6) The item will be Judged basically on the qualities like theme, work on acting, stagecraft, design, and general impression.
- (7) Vulgarity or bitter insinuations in the presentation should be avoided. Only innocent satire or humor is expected.

16. Mime

- Only one entry per institute will be entertained.
- Maximum number of six participants are allowed to participate in this item.
- (3) Judgment will most likely be based on the qualities like the idea, the creativity of presentation, use of makeup, music, and general impression.
- (4) Duration of performance shall be a maximum of 5 minutes.

17. Mimicry

- Each student artist shall be given 5 minutes item both in the Zonal and Inter Zonal Festivals.
- Participants may mimic the sound of machines and speeches of will-know persons etc. including film personalities.
- Only one entry.
- (4) Marking will be based on:
 - Skill imitating.
 - Variety of sounds and voices imitate.
 - (iii) Presentation.

18. On-the-Spot Painting

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- Item will be conducted on the spot and participants will be requested to do painting on the subject given by the in-charge (s) of the competition.
- Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Size of the painting will be half imperial size drawing paper i.e., 22 inches X 15 inches.
- Painting can be done in oil, water, poster, or pastel colors.
- (6) Candidate shall bring their material like brushes, paints, etc. Only the paper/ sheet will be provided by the host institute.

19. Collage

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- Item will be conducted on the spot on the given topic/subject, sheet size 22"X15".
- (3) Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Participants shall bring their scissors, pasting, and other material required for the contest.
- (5) All Collages must be prepared from old magazines. The host University will provide the drawing paper of the size 22" X 15".

20. Poster Making

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) Item will be conducted on the spot and the participants will be requested to do poster making on the subject/topic theme given by the In-charge of the competition.
- (3) Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Participants shall bring their material. Only the Drawing paper/ Sheet 22" x 15" will be provided by the organizers.

21. Clay Modeling

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- Item will be conducted on the spot.
- Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Topics/ size and other specific rules shall be announced on the spot.
- Clay shall be provided by the host institute.

22. Cartooning

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) Item will be conducted on the spot on the given subject/ idea.
- (3) Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Participants shall bring their material. Only the Drawing paper 22" x 15" will be provided by the host University.

23. Rangoli

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (3) Participants shall bring their material. This art is no different in Various regions Such as Mandna, Alpana, Alekhan, Kolam, Rangoli, etc. For this, the medium and form for Expression can be free-hand, pictorial, and descriptive
- (4) Only one medium shall be used Poster Colours or Flower Petals or Saw- dust or Pulses or Rice without pasting.
- (5) The Participants shall have to prepare a rangoli within the space provided by the organizers.

24. Spot Photography

- (1) A college/institution can send one participant
- The participant must bring his/her digital camera.
- (3) The digital camera should have a memory card which will be formatted by the judges before the commencement of the contest
- (4) The time limit will be 2.30 hours.
- (5) The participant must capture 5 photographs on the theme announced on the spot by the judges.
- (6) No mixing, matching, or morphing of photographs will be permitted.
- (7) Software such as Photoshop etc. for enhancing images is not permitted.
- (8) The organizers will have all rights for the use of these pictures as and when they deem fit.
- (9) Digital images are evaluated based on (I) IMPACT, and (II) COMPOSITION. (III) TECHNICAL QUALITY, and (IV) SUITABILITY for the specific theme.
- (10) The additional instructions will be announced on the spot.

25. Installation

- Installation or create an atmosphere related to the subject or title of the installation. The size of the installation should be 5'x5'x5' maximum.
- Participants can use all the materials they use in other art compositions like cartooning, painting, rangoli, posters, collages, and clay modeling.
- (3) Participants can use waste material also which is available in the surroundings or can take any material from outside also.
- (4) Participants are not allowed to use any already composed images or forms available in the market. They should compose or create their image with the raw material.
- (5) This is a group activity as four (4) participants can participate but they will create only one installation whose size must not be bigger than 5'x'5'x5'.

JUDGMENT AND APPEALS

The participants are requested to carefully study the rules and regulations for the various events, given in the Handbook of Festival. The decision of the judges appointed for different events shall be final. It is expected that their judgment will be respected. In case of any dissatisfaction, the matter may be referred to the Jury of Appeals. The protest, if any, should be lodged with the Observer of the Competition within one hour of the end of the competition. No protest shall be entertained on matters regarding judgment. Protests can be entertained on matters relating to violation of rules or improper conduct of the contest. There will be a protest fee of Rs.200/- only. This fee will not be refunded unless the protest has been upheld by the Jury of Appeals. No appeal shall lie against the decision of the Jury of Appeals.

IMPORTANT

The participants are requested to study the rules and regulations for the various events given above. The decision of the Judges to appoint efferent events shall be final and binding upon all.

A Brief History of the University

The v.v. John Committee was appointed by Government of Gujarat in April; 1973 to review the status of higher education and establish new universities. Following the recommendations of the committee, the North Gujarat University has been established by North Gujarat University Ordinance (Gujarat Ordinance No.5 of 1986, dated 17-05-1986). The Ordinance was later converted into an Act, passed by Gujarat Legislative Assembly on 29-08-1986 as North Gujarat University Act (No. 22 of 1986, dated 10-09-1986). This University has now been renamed as Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University (by Gujarat Act No. 2 of 2003 dated 01-03-2003), to honour the great philosopher, thinker and Jain acharya Hemchandracharya Suri, who made valuable contribution to the studies in grammar, literature, religion and philosophy.

The jurisdiction of the University covers five districts Viz., Patan, Mehsana, Banas kantha, Saba kantha and Aravalli and caters to cultural and educational needs of this region.

Emblem of the University

The emblem of the University contains a picture of Saraswati framed in a gavaksha or Nich, Devi Saraswati, traditionally representing learning, is depicted after a painting in the old Prakrit manuscript of Dash-Vaikalik. The design of Gavaksha, simple and elegant, is adopted from the excavation of "Rani ki Vav" in Patan.

The emblem thus recalls the ancient art and culture of Gujarat at the peak of its glory centuries ago, when Patan was a great center of learning.

The motto invokes divine blessing of sacred knowledge. It also relates to the Saraswati, the holy Vedic Kumarika River on the bank of which the University is located and which symbolizes and endless flow of ever-growing knowledge.

Hemchandraya ji

Acharya Hemchandra was born in 1088 A.D. into the Modha Vanik (merchant) caste, in the town of Dhandhuka, sixty miles from the city Ahmedabad in Gujarat State. His parents were Chachadev and Pahini. When Pahini was pregnant, she had a beautiful dream. She narrated her dream to Acharya Devasuri, who was in Dhandhuks at that time. The acharya said that Pahini was to give birth to a son who would make great progress in the areas of spiritual knowledge, intuition, and conduct. Upon the birth the child was named Changdeva.

The next time Acharya Devasuri was in Dhandhuka, he saw Pahini carrying her son. He said to Pahino, "Let me take care of this brilliant son. He is destined to be a great spiritual leader." However, he could not convince her to give him her son. The acharya kept pursuing and reminding that her son would become a famous monk and would glorify the Jain Orer. Again, he requested that she should sacrifice her self-interest and love for the child for the good of the people. Ultimately, Pahini let the acharya take her son with him.

He initiated Changdeva into monkshood and named him Somachandra. The disciple was very intelligent and soon mastered the darshanas, scriptures, nyaya, grammer etc. At the same time, he cultivated excellent virtues like forbearance, tolerance, holiness, simplicity, discipline, chastity and generosity. Somchandra was incomparable in administration and efficienty. Acharya Devasuri made Somachandra an acharya when he was only twenty-one years old. At that time, he was given the name Hemchandra Acharya.

About University

The geographical jurisdiction of the Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University encompasses five districts. Mehsana, Patan, Banaskantha, Sabarkantha and Aravali Each one of the five districts have its own district heritage. Geographically a part of the whole area is towards the desert of Kutchh, while on the North East side are rocky regions of forest populated by the tribal. The economy of the area is largely based on agriculture. There are a few towns here and no big city. The rest of the population lives in villages. With a view to catering to the peculiar cultural and educational needs of the area. Hemchandracharaya North Gujarat University was established by the Ordinance No. 5 of 1986 dated 17-5-1986 which was later passed as the North Gujarat University Act No.22 of 1986 on 11/9/86 by the Legislative Assembly of Gujarat. The University has been functioning since then and growing and expanding steadily.

PATAN a town in Patan district, was chosen for the University Headquarter. The historical importance of the place cannot be underestimated. For centuries, it had been the capital city of a large kingdom extending far beyond the boundaries of present-day Gujarat, under the Solanki rulers and a very important seat of Jain scholarship. It is the holy land of Hemchandracharya a great thinker who made valuable contribution to the studies in grammar, literature, religion and philosophy. The RANI-KI-VAV, Queen's Stepwell, the 900 years old Structure was constructed by

Gujjar King Bhimdev of Solanki dynasty was attributed to Queen Udayamati. It has been listed as on of UNESCO's word Heritage sites since 2014. New ₹100 currency note bears image of Ran-Ki-Vav which is looks system like temple cum water storage system. Patan is known for 'Patola', a doable likat woven highly valued silk saries. A great architectural and sculptural monument of yester years, the lakes of Sahastralinga and Khansarovar, the Jain temples of Panchasara and a few other remains in and around the place testify to the glory that was Patan, in not-so-distant past.

About Patan

In childhood you built, yourself a fort of sheets and pillows, and discovered that the enclosure gave you the freedom to explore. Now enter the town of Patan, hugged by its fort walls and gates still largely intact, and re-discover the spirit of play.

You meander through the bustling bazaar of this charismatic town. Tucked away among the havelis in the narrow pole you stumble upon rope or bidi (traditional cigarette) makers working on their doorsteps. You go on a treasure hunt in search of the unique patola and mashru weavers, the snow-white Jain temples, the Hemchandracharya Jain Gyan library of ancient Hindu and Jain texts.

You find yourself leaving the city walls heading north-west, as if something calls you. On your way to Anhilvada Patan, the ancient city that served as Gujarat's capital for 650 years, you find the 1000-year-old Kali temple from where Kali mata, the kuldevi (family goddess) of the Solanki dynasty, guards the town. Furthest north, you find the Sahastralinga Talav, literally "lake of a thousand lingas", which is finely constructed to channel water in from the nearby Saraswati, and you begin to realize that it is the sanctity of water that has been and still is, beckoning you. You turn around and come towards the edge of Rani Ki Vav, the "Queen's stepwell", and as you descend into the cool air towards the water, the carved stone gods and consorts invite you into their world, the world of spirit and the sacred. Here, in the infinite, your journey is always just beginning.

The ancient city of Anahilvada Patan was founded by Vanraj Chavda, the first of the Chavda dynasty. Legend has it that he laid the foundation at the place pointed out by Anahil, a shepherd friend from his younger days, and named the city after him.

The city remained as the capital of Gujarat for 650 years, from 746-1411, after the center of power moved from Saurashtra around the same time that the separate kingdoms of the area were integrated into roughly what we today call Gujarat. It was ruled by like dynasties: the Chavda, Solanki, and finally Vaghela. Under the Solanki rule, 942-1244, Anahilvada shone as a center of trade, learning, and architectural achievements. It was also a thriving center for Jainism, and the Solanki rulers commissioned a large number of Hindu and Jain temples, as well as other civic and religious constructions.

During the Vaghela rule towards the end of the 13th century, Ulugh Khan, commander under Alauddin Khilji, plundered the town and destroyed it completely. In 1411 the capital shifted to the newly founded Ahmedabad, leaving Patan as a shadow of its former glory. One of the positive effects of Muslim rule in Patan is the presence of some of the earliest the Muslim buildings in Gujarat, built before even the earliest famous constructions in Ahmedabad.

The ruins of the ancient city, with the famous Rani Ki Vav and Sahastralinga Talav, stand about 2 km northwest of the quaint town of present-day Patan, which is known for its patola saris and mashru weavers.

1. Music

- (a) Classical Vocal Solo: (Hindustani/Karnataka)
- Only one entry per Institution is allowed. Duration of performance- 10 min.
- (2) Time for stage/ Instruments setting is maximum 5 minutes.
- Maximum number of accompanists is two.
- (4) Item can be presented in either Hindustani or Karnataka style.
- (5) Cinema songs are not allowed under this item.
- (6) Sufficient thought and care must be exercised in the choice of Raga and composition.
- (7) Judgment will be based on the qualities like, tal, selection of raga, composition and general impression.

2. Classical Instrumental Solo (Percussion - Tal Vadya)

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed. Duration of performance- 10 min.
- (2) Time for stage/ Instruments setting is maximum 5 minutes.
- (3) Maximum number of accompanists is two.
- (4) Participants must bring their own instruments.
- (5) item can be presented in either Hindustani or Karnatk style.
- (6) Judgment will be based on the qualities like, taal, selection of rage, composition and general impression.

Classical Instrumental Solo (Non- Percussion – Swar Vadya)

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed. Duration of performance- 10 min.
- (2) Time for stage/ Instruments setting is maximum 5 minutes.
- (3) Maximum number of accompanists is two.
- (4) Participants must bring their own instruments, Casio not allowed.
- (5) Instruments of western origin adopted to the India Raga system are allowed.
- (6) Item can be presented in either Hindustani or Karnataka style.
- (7) Judgment will be based on the qualities like, swara, tal, selection of raga, composition and general impression.

4. Light Vocal (Indian)

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed.
- (2) Time for Stage/ Instruments setting is maximum 2 minutes.
- (3) The number of accompanists would not be more than two:
- (4) Duration of the song shall be between 4 to 6 minutes.
- (5) Only non-film songs/ geet/ ghazal/ bhajan/ shabad and abhangas can be presented.
- (6) Judgment will be made on the qualities like swara, taal, selection of raga, composition and general impression.

Western Vocal Solo

- Only one entry per institution is allowed.
- (2) Time for Stage/ instruments setting is maximum 2 minutes.
- (3) The number of accompanists would not be more than two.
- (4) Duration of the song shall be between 4 to 6 minutes.
- Language of the song shall only be English.
- (6) Judgment will be made on the qualities like, composition rhythm, coordination and general impression

6. Group Song (Indian)

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed.
- Ateam has to present two songs, one patriotic and another will be a folksong.
- (3) Maximum 6 singers in a group and number of accompanists playing instruments shall be three.
- (4) The group songs should be taken from indian songs which can be in regional language.
- No film song should be presented as group song.
- (6) Maximum time allowed for the group song is 10 minutes which does not include setting time. The setting time for a group shall not exceed 4 minutes.
- (7) Judging of this item will be on the basis of quality of singing only and not on make-up, costumes and actions of the team.

7. Group Songs (Western)

- (1) Only one entry per institution is allowed.
- (2) Maximum 6 singers in a group maximum number of accompanists playing instruments shall be three.
- (3) The group songs should be taken from English language.
- (4) Maximum time allowed for the group song is 10 minutes which does not include setting time. The setting time for a group shall not exceed 5 minutes.
- (5) Judging of this items will be on the basis of quality of singing only and not on make-up, costumes and actions of the team.

8. Folk Orchestra

- Each University can send only one team.
- (2) The team shall consist of up to 12 participants:
- The group can consist of all boys or all girls or combined.
- (4) The duration of the performance will be a minimum for 7 and a maximum for 10 minutes.
- (5) This does not include setting time which shall not be more than 5 minutes.
- (6) Up to three professional accompanists are allowed who should be in different dress from the student participants so that they could be easily identified.
- The professional accompanists shall sit / stand separately from the participants and shall not lead the team.

(8) The team may present preferably those folk tunes which are recognized as folk tunes of the state to which the university belongs)

9. Folk/Tribal Dance

- Only one entry per Institution is allowed.
- (2) Maximum 10 participants allowed per team. The team may consist of all boys, all girls or a mixture of both.
- The number of accompanists permissible is five.
- (4) The dance can be either primitive or a folk dance (Indian Style) but not a classical one.
- (5) Duration of dance should not be more than 10 minutes:
- (6) Three copies of a brief note giving the theme and the text of song if any, is to be submitted along with the entry format the time of registration.
- (7) The participating team will be responsible for removal of their sets / properties etc. immediately after the completion of their performance.
- (8) Judgment will be based on the basis of Rhythm, Formation, Expression, Costumes, Make-up, Sets on Overall Effect
- (9) Time for sets/Instruments setting is maximum 5 minutes.

10. Classical Dance(Indian)

- Each Institute can send only one entry.
- (2) The classical dance can be from any of the approved schools of dance. Such as Kathak, Kathakali, Bharat Natyam, Manipuri, Kuchipudi, Mohinittam, Odissi etc.
- (3) Participant will be allowed up to 15 minutes including time for preparation. Maximum three accompanists are permissible.
- (4) Judgment will be based on the qualities like Tal, Technique, Rhythm, Abhinaya or Expression, Costumes, Footwork and general impression etc.
- (5) Three copies of a brief note on the description of dance story involved in it, if any, and of the accompanying song, with its meaning in Hindi or English must be submitted at the time of registration.

11. Quiz

- Each Institute can send ateam of three persons.
- (2) There will be a written preliminary round and teams will be elected for the final.
- Finals will be or al with audio-visual questions.
- (4) The Specific rules regarding evaluation procedure, time to reply a particular answer and the type of round will be given before the actual start of the competition.

12. Elecution

- Each Institute will be represented by one speaker.
- Medium of expression will be Hindi or English.
- (3) Each speaker will be allowed to speak for maximum five minutes in the Zonal Festival and 10 minutes in the National Festival.
- (4) Subject / Topic of Elocution will be announced in the managers meeting.
- (5) The performance will be judged in one language.
- (6) The item shall be prose or poetry and not song.
- (7) The sequence of speakers will be decided by a draw of lots:

13. Debate

- Each Institute will be represented by the two debators, one will speak FDR, While another will speak AGAINST the motion.
- Medium of expression will be Hindi or English.
- Topic of Debater will be announced 24 hours in advance.
- (4) Each debater will be allowed to speak for maximum five minutes in the Zonal Festival and 10 minutes in the National Festival.
- (5) The competitor from each institute will speak FOR and AGAINST the motion. Paper reading is not allowed.

14. One-Act-Play

- Only one entry shall be accepted from each institution.
- (2) The duration of the play should not exceed 30 minutes.
- (3) Time will be counted as soon as the signal is given or the team starts giving introduction, whichever is earlier. Empty stage to empty stage shall be followed strictly. For stage setting and removal of set and properties, up to 10 minutes will be given after taking charge of the stage.
- (4) The number of participants should not exceed nine and the maximum number of accompanists should not exceed three. The participating team shall bring their own set/ stage property, make up material etc. Light and general property such as ordinary furniture may be provided on advance information.
- (5) Participants may speak in Hindi, English or any regional language of India. In case, the language is a regional one, the synopsis of the play with translation in, English or Hindi must be submitted to the in-charge of the competition on the day of
- (6) registration.
- (7) The participating team must report to the in charge of the competition at least two hours before the presentation of the play.
- (8) Judgment will most likely be based on the qualities of the play like theme, work on acting, stage craft, design and general impression etc.
- Obecision of the panel of judges will be final and binding upon all.
- (10) Accompanists will either speak from the background or will play upon musical instruments for background music. They shall not appear on the stage.

15. Skit

- Only one team per institute will be allowed.
- Maximum number of six participants are allowed to participate in this item.
- Maximum time allotted for each team is 10 minutes.
- (4) Use of make-up, drapery and background music is allowed. No personal remarks, aspersions, character assassination etc. is allowed.
- (5) Participating team should submit three copies of the synopsis of the theme of Skit, along with language of presentation (Hindi or English) on the day of registration.
- (6) The item will be Judged basically on the qualities like theme, work on acting, stage craft, design and general impression.
- (7) Vulgarity or bitter insinuations in presentation should be avoided. Only innocent satire or humor is expected.

16. Mime

- Only one entry per institute will be entertained.
- Maximum number of six participants are allowed to participate in this item.
- (3) Judgment will most likely be based on the qualities like idea, creativity of presentation, use of make-up, music and general impression.
- (4) Duration of performance shall be maximum of 5 minutes.

17. Mimicry

- (1) Each student artist shall be given 5 minutes item both in the Zonal And inter Zonal Festivals.
- (2) Participants may mimic sound of machines and speeches of will know persons etc. including film personalities.
- Only one entry.
- (4) Marking will be based on:
 - Skillimitating.
 - (11) Variety of sound and voices imitate.
 - (111) Presentation.

18. On the Spot Painting

- (1) Each institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) item will be conducted on the spot and participants will be requested to do painting on the subject given by the in charge (s) of the competition.
- (3) Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Size of the painting will be half imperial size drawing paper i.e. 22 inches X 15 inches.
- (5) Painting can be done in oil, water, poster or pastel colours.
- (6) Candidate shall bring their own material like brushes, paints etc. Only the paper/ sheet will be provided by the host institute.

19. Collage

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) Item will be conducted on the spot on the given topic / subject, sheet size 22"X15".
- Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Participants shall bring their own scissors, pasting and other material required for the contest.
- (5) All Collage has to be prepared from old magazines. The host University will provide the drawing paper of the size 22° X 15°.

20. Poster Making

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) Item will be conducted on the spot and the participants will be requested to do poster making on the subject / topic / theme given by the in-charge of the competition.
- Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Participants shall bring their own material. Only the Drawing paper/ Sheet 22" x 15" will be provided by the organizers.

21. Clay Modeling

- Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) Item will be conducted on the spot.
- (3) Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Topics/ size and other specific rules shall be announced on the spot.
- Clay shall be provided by the host institute.

22. Cartooning

- (1) Each institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) Item will be conducted on the spot on the given subject/ idea.
- Duration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (4) Participants shall bring their own material. Only the Drawing paper 22" x 15" will be provided by the host University.

23. Rangoli

- (1) Each Institute will be represented by one participant.
- (2) Buration will not be more than 2 hours 30 minutes.
- (3) Participants shall bring their own material. This art is know differently in Various regions Such as Mandna, Alpana, Alekhan, Kolam, Rangoli, etc. For this the medium and form for Expression can be free hand, pictorial and descriptive
- (4) Only one medium shall be used Poster Colours or Flower Petals or Saw-dust or Pulses or Rice without pasting.
- (5) The Participants shall have to prepare a rangell within the space provided by the organizers.

24. Spot Photography

- A college/institution can send one participant
- (2) The participant has to bring his/her own digital camera.
- (3) The digital camera should have a memory card which will be formatted by the judges before the commencement of the contest
- (4) The time limit will be 2.30 hours.
- (5) The participant has to capture 5 photographs on the theme announced on the spot by the judges.
- (6) No mixing, matching or morphing of photographs will be permitted.
- (7) Software such as Photoshop etc. for enhancing images not permitted.
- (8) The organizers will have all rights for the use of these pictures as and when they deem fit.
- (9) Digital images are evaluated on the basis of (I) IMPACT, (II) COMPOSITION. (III) TECHNICAL QUALITY, and (IV) SUITABILITY for the specific theme.
- (10) The additional instructions will be announced on the spot.

25. Installation

- Installation or create an atmosphere related with the subject or title of the installation. The size of the installation should be 5'x5'x5' maximum.
- (2) Participants can use all the material which they use in other art compositions like cartooning, painting, rangoli, poster, collage and clay modeling.
- (3) Participants can use waste material also which is available in the surroundings or can take any material from outside also.
- (4) Participants are not allowed to use any already composed images or forms available in the market. They should compose or create their own image with the raw material.
- (5) This is a group activity as four (4) participants can participate but they will create only one installation whose size must not be bigger than 5'x'5'x5'.

JUDGMENTAND APPEALS

The participants are requested to carefully study the rules and regulations for the various events, given in Handbook of Festival. The decision of the judges appointed for different events shall be final. It is expected that their judgment will be respected. In case of any dissatisfaction, the matter may be referred to the Jury of Appeals. The protest, if any, should be lodged with the Observer of the Competition within one hour of the end of the competition. No protest shall be entertained on matters regarding judgment. Protests can be entertained on matters relating to violation of rules or improper conduct of the contest. There will be a protest fee of Rs.200/- only. This fee will not be refunded unless the protest has been upheld by the Jury of Appeals. No appeal shall lie against the decision of the Jury of Appeals.

IMPORTANT

The participants are requested to study the rules and regulations for the various events give above. The decision of the Judges appoint efferent events shall be final and binding upon all.
